



CHANGING ATTITUDES BY EDUCATION

The Eyes have it, the Eyes have it! Most collisions (no, they are not accidents because they are avoidable) are caused by one or more parties to the collision failing to use their eyes to see what is happening around them. Gaining information through observation about what is happening around you is mostly gained from the eyes continuously scanning as far as you can see, the middle and foreground, behind you and to the sides. If your eyesight becomes defective through slow degradation due to illness or age or is affected by drink or drugs you become a danger to yourself and to those that are sharing the road.

Looking but failing to see a hazard can also be the result of the driver being distracted by the radio, other occupants of the vehicle or, dare I say, using a mobile telephone whether hands-free or not. How often have you had a near miss because you failed to see the motorcyclist, cyclist, pedestrian etc?

Our local Police have recently attended crashes where drivers have failed the basic eyesight test. In one case not only could the driver not see the number plate and fail to read the letters and numbers until just 7 metres away (should be 20.5m) but, to make matters worse, at first they could not even see that the number plate was attached to a Police BMW "Battenberg" marked traffic car.

Top Tip: You are sharing the road with these people with poor vision. You have seen them, but have they really seen you? People look but they don't always see so treat all other drivers/riders with caution.

AN EYE ON NATURE

Brampton Wood is currently undergoing something of a transformation. One of Cambridgeshire's richest wildlife sites with a long history of human management, the wood is being restored as a wonderful example of ancient woodland. The last major impact was felt in the 1950s when in 1956 the Ministry of Agriculture Fisheries and Food (MAFF) purchased Brampton Wood. The land was subsequently managed by the Forestry Commission who replanted about one-fifth with conifers.

This practice was common in the 1950s with a perceived need for timber for, amongst other things, pit props in our coal mines. Other ancient woodland sites suffered a similar fate including Wildlife Trust reserves such as Gamlingay Wood. Unfortunately this had a dramatic impact on the fauna and flora with the closely planted conifers blocking out the sunlight and casting dense shade for 12 months of the year. This prevented the bluebells and primroses flowering and giving us a unique sea of blue so typical of Britain's ancient woodland.

Nature was dealt a helping hand when the Wildlife Trust purchased the wood in 1992. One of the aims was to restore the wood to its former glory as a premier site for nature, so over several years blocks of conifers were felled and the timber removed. Another block has been finished earlier this year.

Given the chance, nature has a habit of bouncing back and Brampton Wood is no exception. Where previously rows of pines grew regimentally, native species of trees have grown and the ground flora is returning. You would not know some of the areas were ever a dense canopy of conifers such is the success of this venture in restoration. Do take a visit yourself this Summer and see how transformed the wood is with a bright future for wildlife.

However it is a great achievement to reach the semis and finals, so well done to everyone one involved – a lot more people don't get that far!!!


