



Poxit, Grexit - call it what you like, but the Post Office has left Green End Road, Sawtry after 50 years as a family-run business. Sawtry's expansion was in its infancy with a population of a little more than 1000 when my father Ernie accepted the appointment in May 1966 and I joined him 34 years ago.

As a family we feel relieved not to have faced an armed robbery which was not uncommon in the earlier years. Whilst on the subject, many customers expressed concern for my mother, Peggy, after the incident when a JCB digger attacked the ATM in July. Thank you, she is fine.

The BBC broadcast a programme in June last year entitled '*Signed, Sealed and Delivered*', highlighting the problems within the Post Office and the introduction of the Network Transformation Programme. Their plans left me with no alternative other than to try and leave the business with a compensation payment. Four years ago, when the plans were formulated I was against the proposal, but due to changing circumstances, I genuinely welcome the opportunity to retire now.

It has been a pleasure to have served the community and to get to know so many people. I'd like to thank our regular customers for their loyalty over the years and express appreciation of long serving employees, Mary Hubbard and Margaret McFadyzean (13yrs & 18yrs respectively, who both worked for me until retirement.

Finally, I wish Peter and the Post Office Local model every success in the new location at the Best One shop on Greenways.

## TRUSTEES' WEEK: 7<sup>TH</sup> - 13<sup>TH</sup> NOVEMBER

### What are trustees?

Trustees are the people in charge of a charity. They help to make the UK the sixth most giving country in the world. They play a vital role, volunteering their time and working together to make important decisions about the charity's work. Trustees' Week is an annual event to showcase the great work that trustees do and highlight opportunities for people from all walks of life to get involved and make a difference.



## SAWTRY HISTORY SOCIETY

Mail Coaches on the Post Road was a talk given on 21<sup>st</sup> July by Brian White. In the 17<sup>th</sup> Century roads began to improve, making it easier to travel and Mail Coaches were introduced to carry post as well as passengers up and down the country. The Coaches were mainly pulled by two horses sometimes four and led to the introduction of the Coaching Inns up and down the routes like those in Stilton, Stamford and Huntingdon, many of which remain today. Horses were sometimes changed at the Inns.

In 1874 a Mr Palmer devised a timetable and mile posts showed the distance between towns. Charges were made to carry the post from 1/2d – 2 shillings depending on the journey and if you had to cross the border to Edinburgh. Many passengers travelled on top of the coach with the driver and luggage. Some Inns provided food and accommodation for an overnight stop.

Toll Roads were set up, making the driver pay to travel on certain roads and the money was used for maintaining the highways. It also encouraged Highwaymen who held up the coaches to rob the passengers, this brought about the guard who carried a Blunderbuss and pistols to protect everyone. It was said that the most likely roads to get held up was between London and Stamford – remember Dick Turpin! But the mail got through whatever the weather and dangers.

In 1829 "Post Offices" were built, a sight to see in London, it encouraged to gentry to stroll out in the evenings to see it. The last coach was in 1848 from London to Newmarket when four horses were used.

At the end of July we had a trip to Hampton Court Palace enjoyed by one and all.

On 20<sup>th</sup> October there will be a slide show 'Now and Then'.

### AN EYE ON NATURE

Judging by the number of visitors who walk in Aversley Wood, the fact that it is no longer private has not been lost on the people of Sawtry. But when you walk your dog or admire the drifts of bluebells, do you ever wonder about its fascinating past?

Aversley was bought by the Woodland Trust in two equal parts; the first in 1979 and the second in 1982. We can now benefit from this every day of the year.

The history of Aversley Wood started after the last Ice Age, when the northern part was colonised by the first trees. The southern part was cleared long ago and farmed up to the Black Death in the Middle Ages. With so few people surviving, the farmland was abandoned in favour of more productive land. The two parts of Aversley were separated by a large bank and ditch, which snaked its way roughly NW to SE. One of the paths marks this boundary today. The abandoned farmland, now covered in trees, was managed in the traditional ridge and furrow system. Evidence of this is still clearly visible in very wet winters when the furrows fill with water, picking out the ridges above the water level. An ancient cattle droving road – the Bullock Road – marks the SW boundary and just off the road, just inside the wood, an "armed pond" can be found. This is one of the few remaining in the East Midlands. This pond would have been a welcome watering place for the animals destined for market.

This special wood has been designated by the Nature Conservancy Council (now Natural England) as a Site of Special Scientific Interest (SSSI). One of the iconic species which helped to give the wood SSSI status is the wild service tree. This species only lives in any numbers in ancient woodland that has been in existence since 1600. The leaves turn orange to red in early autumn, ahead of the other trees.

Visitors enjoy the drifts of bluebells in spring. They grow in abundance in various areas of the wood, with flowering time dependent on the location. The north-facing slope patch tends to flower later than the area near the main entrance gate.

A note of caution – the primroses have disappeared due to picking, which occurred mostly on Good Fridays during the days the wood was in private hands. Whether they will recolonise remains to be seen but if they do, please don't pick them or any other wild flowers. Please leave them for everyone to enjoy. The owners – the Woodland Trust – have provided us with a wonderful place to walk and enjoy a unique woodland experience. They ask little of us in return – just to respect the wood and enjoy it on foot, not by any other means of transport.

## SAWTRY HISTORY THEN & NOW

Our ongoing series from Sawtry History Society on the stories behind old buildings which can still be seen around the area today

### THE OLD MILL, SAWTRY



The Mill is situated on the south side of Gidding Road, built either in the late 1600s or early 1700s and called a Smock Mill, believed to be named after Mills from Holland in the 17<sup>th</sup> Century. It had four floors, the ground and first floors was made of undressed stone followed by an Oak frame to the second floor which held three pairs of over driven stones and two burr stones for wheat and offal and one pair of peak stones for barley, the third floor was used for storage and the fourth held the all-wooden machinery. The Mill has been used by farmers for grinding the corn into flour for the bakers and for grinding the 'gleanings' (loose corn picked up by local villagers) for their own use. In 1778 there was some renovations when a stone was carved with the date and on the third floor in 1817 an inscription was carved that it had survived a terrible storm.

The Mill was once owned by Stephen Hart and bought by Charles Bannister in 1854. Charles Bannister was born in Gosberton in 1819 and moved to Sawtry in 1840, married Elizabeth Hodson Scotney, they had 14 children. It appears a Samuel Hodson also occupied the Mill in 1854, Charles died of a stroke in 1872 aged 53. Elizabeth took over the running of the Mill.

At some point Steam Power was installed as between 1890 and 1906 it was discovered that both steam and wind were used to power the sails. According to the Kelly's directories the Mill was run between Robert Turnill and George Bannister one of Charles and Elizabeth son. A tragic event took place on 19<sup>th</sup> April 1872, their 3 year old daughter Annie was out with her brother aged 6 and another little boy aged 5, they entered a hovel where they found a loaded gun. They described the event as one boy was holding the gun and the other "pulled a piece of iron", unfortunately the gun discharged into the body of the little girl. The inquest, which was held in the Chequers Inn, ruled it was an accidental death.

The last owner of the Mill was Esme Turnill. The Mill was bought by John Bradshaw of Cotterstock in the 1950's and he still has the Mill Stone with the date 1778 carved on it as previously mentioned, he said he has it "leaning up in his yard, it is a large round stone with a square hole". The Mill is now under private ownership.

## FAIRTRADE WEDDING GOLD

Each Fairtrade Wedding Ring will be imprinted with the unique Fairtrade Gold Stamp so that couples know that the miners were paid a fair price for the gold plus an extra amount of money in the form of the Fairtrade Premium, to invest in building their future.

The Fairtrade gold in the rings comes from SOTRAMI gold mine, located in the Atacama Desert in Peru, 70 miles from the nearest town. The artisanal small scale mining community consists of 500 families and had little access to amenities such as shops and health care before selling on Fairtrade terms. Since becoming certified, the miners have helped improve the lives of the town's inhabitants by investing the Fairtrade Premium in a primary school and dentistry and a not-for-profit grocery store in the community so people can buy food at affordable prices. In the future they plan to help improve health care, waste management, electricity and water supplies for the town's inhabitants.

Artisanal small scale mining is driven by poverty and draws people who have no other option. When unregulated, the conditions faced by miners can be dangerous and polluting. Miners are often exploited by middle men and don't receive a fair price for their gold.

## QUESTIONS FOR THE GARDENER

**My old Dorothy Perkins rambler rose seems well passed it, can it be rejuvenated?**

Dorothy Perkins can be quite a vigorous rambler and requires regular pruning, try annually pruning out the old flowering stems so that it produces strong replacement stems each year from its base. Remember flowers are formed on wood produced in the previous year. They are best pruned between August & September. Make sure that if you decide to grow rambler roses that you are well aware of their eventual size and have the space.

Ramblers are best trained horizontally as possible onto a structure such as a fence or wall etc that will show off the flowers to their best.

Old, overgrown ramblers can be renovated by hard pruning. The best way to do this is to cut out some of the older woody stems first then cut out any dead, diseased, or dying wood and cut out any remaining weak shoots right back to the base, while retaining any new developing canes. Prune the side laterals back on any retained stems to **2-3 buds** or **4-5 in.** If you just have a complete tangled mess then you can cut back the whole plant right back down to its base. The new replacement stems will come from the base in Spring, tie these in when they are long enough. Seems somewhat drastic but it ensures a much healthier plant in the end.

**Tip:** Nourish shrubs well after any **HARD** pruning.

### I'm a good driver, why should I drive at 30 mph or less in a 30 mph zone?

The figure of 30 mph is a "limit" and not a "target". Its purpose is to try and reduce the risk of a fatality in the event of a collision between a car and a pedestrian, cyclist or similar by instructing drivers that they must drive slower through a restricted area. If 20 mph is a more appropriate speed in a 30 mph zone then drive at 20 mph. The chances of a pedestrian being killed when in a collision with a car are:

- 20 mph – 1 in 40 killed
- 30 mph – 1 in 5 killed
- 35 mph – 1 in 2 killed
- 40 mph – 9 out of 10 killed

1 in 3 convictions for causing death by dangerous driving are drivers under 21 years old. The sentence is up to 14 years in prison.

Drivers who speed have a collision risk three to five times greater than those who don't.

### Any fool can drive fast – an advanced driver knows when to drive slow.

CADAR is a club where members are coached in advanced driving techniques using the System of Car Control as taught to police drivers. CADAR has both male and female tutors and will coach drivers, or riders, of any age from 18 onwards.

For an annual membership fee of £10.00 you can be coached in advanced driving (or riding) techniques and will be encouraged to take the RoSPA Advanced Driving Test. If you just want to be coached but not take the test then that is fine also.

### This issue's top tips:

- Allow at least two seconds between you and the vehicle in front. In the wet allow at least 4 seconds and much more when it is icy.
- Avoid distractions when driving as they can adversely affect reaction times. Distractions can include mobile phones, in-car entertainment and over talkative passengers.

For someone still at school, standing in front of a roomful of people with professional backgrounds and delivering a speech you've written yourself, including in each case a professional-looking slide show (so dealing with the technology in front of an audience) must be an ordeal. All three did this with confidence – it was an impressive display. Their parents – who came to watch – must have been proud.

- Sweep chimney at least once a year and get brickwork inspected, especially the chimney breast and roof space.
- Do not bank fires too high or overload the grate, and remember to let them burn down well and check the hearth before going to bed.
- Use a fire or spark guard to prevent accidental fires.
- Do not place objects on or over the mantle-piece which may cause you to stand too close to the fire to reach or use them.
- Burn only suitable fuels and avoid burning resinous woods as soot builds up quickly.

Above all, ensure you have a working smoke alarm fitted on each floor or your home and a carbon monoxide alarm installed.

Some bikers will, at this time of the year, be looking to hibernate their beloved machines for the winter – so here are a few tips:

**Service** – it's advisable to service the bike before laying up (even if not technically 'due'). At the least, change the oil & filters.

**Fuel** – don't empty the tank. If moisture gets in it could cause corrosion. Consider adding a fuel preservative or conditioner to prevent the fuel degrading.

**Battery** – put it on a trickle-charger (if it's the type of battery you can charge).

**Tyres** – put the bike up on the centre stand or a paddock stand in order to take the pressure off the tyres. Failing that, move the bike around every few weeks.

**Corrosion** – consider giving the metal parts a spray with a corrosion inhibitor (e.g. WD40).

**Gear** – clean all your kit (including crash helmet) and store somewhere dry.

That's it for now. If you're continuing to ride during the winter, then please ride safely
